How the legacy package has been used so far

So far Healthwatch Newcastle has acted on some of Newcastle LINk's quick tips and recommendations. We have:

- Used Newcastle LINk's policies and procedures where possible
- Written role descriptions for volunteers
- Set up a process to ensure volunteers have the right skills and abilities for their role
- Set up a support and supervision process for volunteers
- Set up a governance subgroup to deal with policies and procedures
- Taken time to get to know key local voluntary and community sector organisations
- Spoken to key people about any issues we are picking up as soon as possible

By delivering our future plans we will also act on these quick tips and recommendations:

- Make use of themed task and finish groups
- Make use of the local volunteer centre and www.do-it.org.uk
- Scrutinise our work to see which community views are missing and fill the gap by working with organisations that specialise in working with that community
- Recruit, train and send representatives to appropriate external meetings
- Agree a protocol for working with the Care Quality Commission
- Continue Newcastle LINk's work on walk-in centres (this will be covered when Healthwatch Newcastle considers North of Tyne's out of hours service)
