Project overview	Public Health shared information with Newcastle Health Scrutiny about the variability, and in some cases very low uptake, of cancer screening (breast, cervical and bowel). Discussions with the CCG and others following this showed that it was of concern across Newcastle and Gateshead. Research in this area is needed to find out why people in low uptake areas think uptake is low, what they think the barriers are to attending and how these barriers could be overcome.  We plan to engage with those communities in Newcastle where uptake of screening is low. Through engagement, we aim to identify what the barriers are to attending appointments and ways to overcome them.  This research will take place in Newcastle first and then possibly be repeated in Gateshead.
